DONATION/RECYCLING GUIDELINES

Clothes

- Clean and in good condition (no rips or stains).
- In-season clothes only (no parkas in July).
- Put in bags, not on hangers.
- Separate children's and adults' clothes.

Household Items, Bric-a-Brac, and Linens

- Clean and in good condition.
- In bags or boxes (box fragile items, please).

Books, Games, Toys

- Separate books into adult hardcovers, adult paperbacks, and kid's books.
- Toys and games must be clean and in good condition — with all parts included.

Furniture, Small Appliances, and Electronics

- Clean and in good condition.
- Small appliances and electronics must work.

Sorry, we cannot accept:

- Air conditioners
- Car seats
- Computers
- Computer monitors
- Encyclopedias
- Exercise equipment
- Large appliances
- LP albums
- Mattresses
- Skis
- Televisions
- Textbooks

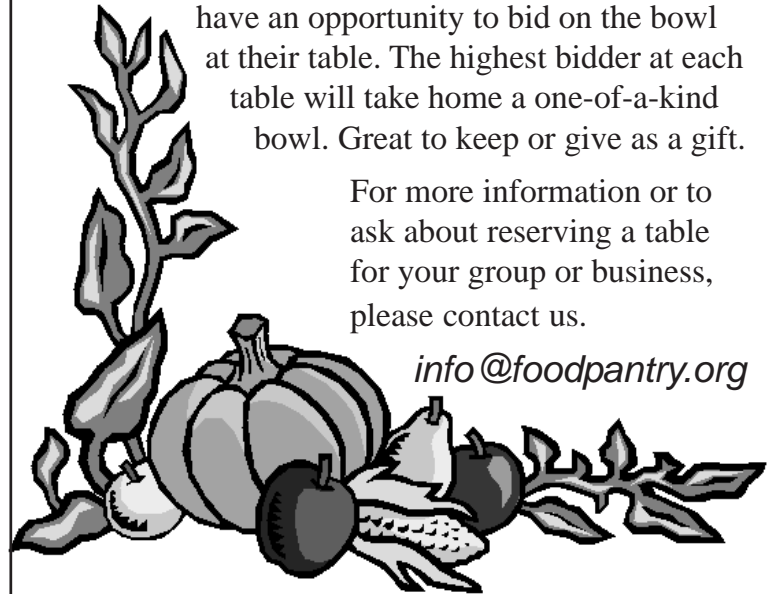
